In the absence of Mayor Saari, acting Mayor Heyblom called the meeting to order at 5:30 pm which was followed by the Pledge of Allegiance. Under unfinished business, Clerk Kurtock informed the council that 16 applications for the Small Cities Grant program had been accepted, with one still in process, and 3 or 4 still available. Resolution 2022-04 authorizing Clerk Kurtock as signatory for DEED documents related to the Small Cities Grant program was made by Bruns, seconded by Martin, and passed unanimously on roll call vote. Wold Engineering will present its facilities study to the council on Monday March 21st at 5;30pm. The East Range Sewer Project contained two partial payments with JK Mechanical Engineering being paid \$122,323.60 authorized by a motion made by Gangl, seconded by Bruns, and passed. The second invoice to JPJ Engineering for \$7,382.50 was motioned for approval by Gangl, seconded by Bruns, and passed. A follow-up on the Mesabi Metallics monies presented to Itasca County and the method of its release was explaining as was the formula used by the County for that distribution. Clerk Kurtock explained that it would be at least June before that was worked out. Under New Business, the first item was resolution 2022-05 reestablishing polling places and times. Clerk Kurtock explained.

A motion to approve an RV park management plan with CampLife was moved by Gangl, seconded by Martin, and passed. Resolution 2022-06 establishing City fees, license, and permit charges for 2022 was made by Gangl, seconded by Bruns, and passed by unanimous roll call vote. Under Department and Com-

mittee Reports and Requests, the Fire Department had three items on the agenda with the first being the purchase of a 2022 Polaris side-by-side from Rays Sport for \$33,383.00 to be delivered by June 6th. The motion for approval was made by Bruns, seconded by Martin, and passed. The old machine will be posted on Minnbid action site. The second item was the purchase of all-in-one struts from Alex Air Apparatus for \$2,790.00 with the support motion made by Bruns, seconded by Gangl, and passed.

The last item was the transfer of \$134,190.98 of COVID Relief Funds to the General Fund 100 to cover Fire Department equipment with the motion made by Gangl, seconded by Martin, and passed. The Ambulance service had two new items with the first being the motion to hire Sammi Jo Grife as a paid-on-call EMR effective March 2nd, made by Gangl, seconded by Bruns, and passed. The second item was a motion to consider the approval of Medical Director Agreement with MJM Medical Direction Consortium Services Corporation to provide direction to the Nashwauk Ambulance service for an annual fee of \$4,800.00 made by Bruns, seconded by Gangl, and passed. The Police Department had three items with the first being a motion to hire Mathew Grossell Jr. as part time police officer effective March 4th, 2022, made by Gangl, seconded by Bruns, and passed. The next item was resolution 2022-05 approving parttime police officers as members of the Public Employees Police and Fire Plan moved by Gangl, seconded by Bruns, and passed unanimously by roll call vote. The last item was a motion allowing Chief Dasovich to hire a Patrol Officer from the eligibility list made by Bruns, seconded by Gangl, and passed. Chief Dasovich gave an update on the 4th of July committee's work, discussions surrounding the upcoming Home Sport and Travel show in April were discussed, as were associated skating rink issues, and signage for the ATV trail. The meeting was adjourned at 6:24.
